### **Technical Assistance for a Sustainable Kansas (TASK)**

 The Industrial Assistance Center proposal is being submitted this week to the Department of Energy. It is a program to provide energy assessment training and internship opportunities for engineering students. CHSR, PPI and AMI are partnering on the initiative.

#### **Sustainability Education**

• Melody LeHew reported on new funding to develop a proposal, "Making Climate Change a Functioning Thread in the Baccalaureate Curriculum: A Transformation in Fiber, Textiles, and Clothing Education." Kansas State University received a USDA challenge grant for Higher Education Planning Grant for a 2012 proposal. Melody's research indicates that social science and humanities educators lack confidence in understanding science of sustainability and there is a need to create professional development opportunities for climate change and other environmental issues for this audience. Melody is looking for partners with expertise in environmental science/sustainability/climate change for 2012 proposal. There will be a planning meeting in Philadelphia at the end of October with the project partners.

### USDA Grant "Biobased Products and Bioenergy,"

- Classes are starting this fall.
- January 2012 Intersession Event Global Aspects of Biobased Products and Bioenergy is the planned topic for the next intersession event. Ron Madl indicated he would be willing to help develop this initiative.
