About CUPPAD




- Created by state legislation in 1968

- Governed by a 37-member commission with an 8-member Executive Committee
- Located in Escanaba, MI
- Serves the central six counties of the Upper Peninsula
 - Alger, Delta, Dickinson, Marquette, Menominee and Schoolcraft

- Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS)
 - A CEDS is a plan developed through a broad-based continuous planning process addressing the economic opportunities and limits of a region.
 - The CEDS is adopted by local units of government before being submitted at the federal level.

Economic Development



 CUPPAD provides program administration, management, support, technical assistance and financial information to satisfy grant requirements of the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC), Economic Development Administration (EDA) and numerous other state and federal funding agencies.

Economic Development



- CUPPAD provides technical assistance for Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)
 - Meet with local communities to review potential projects and coordinate projects with MEDC representatives.
 - Assistance with grant writing, including the development of grant application materials.
 - Assist with CDBG administration requirements including:
 - Environmental review
 - Project monitoring
 - Project closeout
 - Other required administrative activities

- □ Why should planning occur?
 - □ The Michigan Planning Enabling Act requires communities to develop a plan as the basis for a Zoning Ordinance.
 - Planning allows communities to make choices and set goalsrather than simply accept what happens.
 - Planning contributes to orderly growth and development.
 - Planning helps prevent wasteful expenditure of public and private funds.
 - Planning helps to protect property values, largely through zoning, by controlling the impact of one land use on adjacent or nearby land.
 - □ Planning sets the state for building quality places that can attract new workers, businesses and add to the tax base.



What is a Master Plan?

□ A Master Plan is a land use and infrastructure plan that sets forth local goals and recommendations for community growth and redevelopment over the next 20-30 years.

What is a Zoning Ordinance?

Zoning Ordinances allow for the implementation of Master Plans by regulating the use of land, buildings and structures to promote the public health, safety and welfare.

Why should your community adopt a Recreation Plan?

- The Michigan Department of Natural Resources requires each community to develop a 5-year Recreational Plan in order to be eligible for recreational grants, including:
 - Trust Fund Grants
 - Land and Water Conservation Grants
 - Recreation Passport Grants
