The mission of the Women in Engineering program (WiE) is to provide opportunities for engineering women to connect, share, and support each other during their time at Kansas State University. WiE sponsors events and activities providing academic, professional, and social development for women in the college. Academic support is provided through the SAS tutoring program. Professional development is offered through the Society of Women Engineers and department groups. Social networking and activities are provided through WiE mentors and WiE departmental groups. Women mentors and leaders in the College of Engineering create and plan many of the activities.

Women in Engineering (WiE) Mentor Program

WiE Mentors work with women engineering students to create opportunities for women to network and connect socially with other women in the college. Mentors are matched with groups of new women students within their departments to participate in a variety of activities. Mentors serve as a resource for new engineering students. Scholars Assisting Scholars (SAS) Tutoring



Scholars Assisting Scholars (SAS) offers academic support by providing free, walk-in tutoring for students in science, math, and engineering classes. The program is housed in the Fiedler Library. Engineering, math, and science students tutor classes in the freshman and sophomore years. Tutors are also trained to mentor and encourage students in practices for academic success, good study habits, problem solving, and adjusting to college.

Engineering Laboratory Experience

WiE sponsors qualified women engineering students to work in laboratories and facilities to gain experience in engineering research and operations. Undergraduate engineering women interns are selected by faculty or lab managers. Their salaries are paid by WiE. WiE also pays for travel expenses for the laboratory interns to attend professional conferences on behalf of their laboratory.
