#### **Big 12 Faculty Fellowship Program Accepting Applications**

Apply for a Big 12 Faculty Fellowship Award for the 2015-2016 academic year. There are two categories of this award that faculty member may apply: a regular Fellowship Award and a Mentoring Fellowship Award. Both fellowships provide up to \$2,500 for expenses related to a visit by a faculty member to another Big 12 institution. #### **ONR 2015 Young Investigator Program**

The Office of Naval Research (ONR) is interested in receiving proposals for its Young Investigator Program (YIP), 15-FOA-0006. YIP seeks to identify and support academic scientists and engineers who are in their first or second full-time tenure-track or tenure-track-equivalent academic appointment and for FY15, have begun their first appointment on or after Nov. 1, 2009, and who show exceptional promise for doing creative research. The program's objectives are to attract outstanding faculty members of Institutions of Higher Education (hereafter also called "universities") to the Department of Navy's (DoN's) research program, to support their research, and to encourage their teaching and research careers. Proposals should address research areas described in the ONR science and technology (S&T) department section of ONR's website. Full proposals are due no later than 4:00 PM EST on Wednesday, March 4, 2015.
